

INSTRUCTIONS FOR ASSEMBLING U. S. MARSHAL

BEFORE ASSEMBLING MODEL, STUDY SKETCH CAREFULLY.

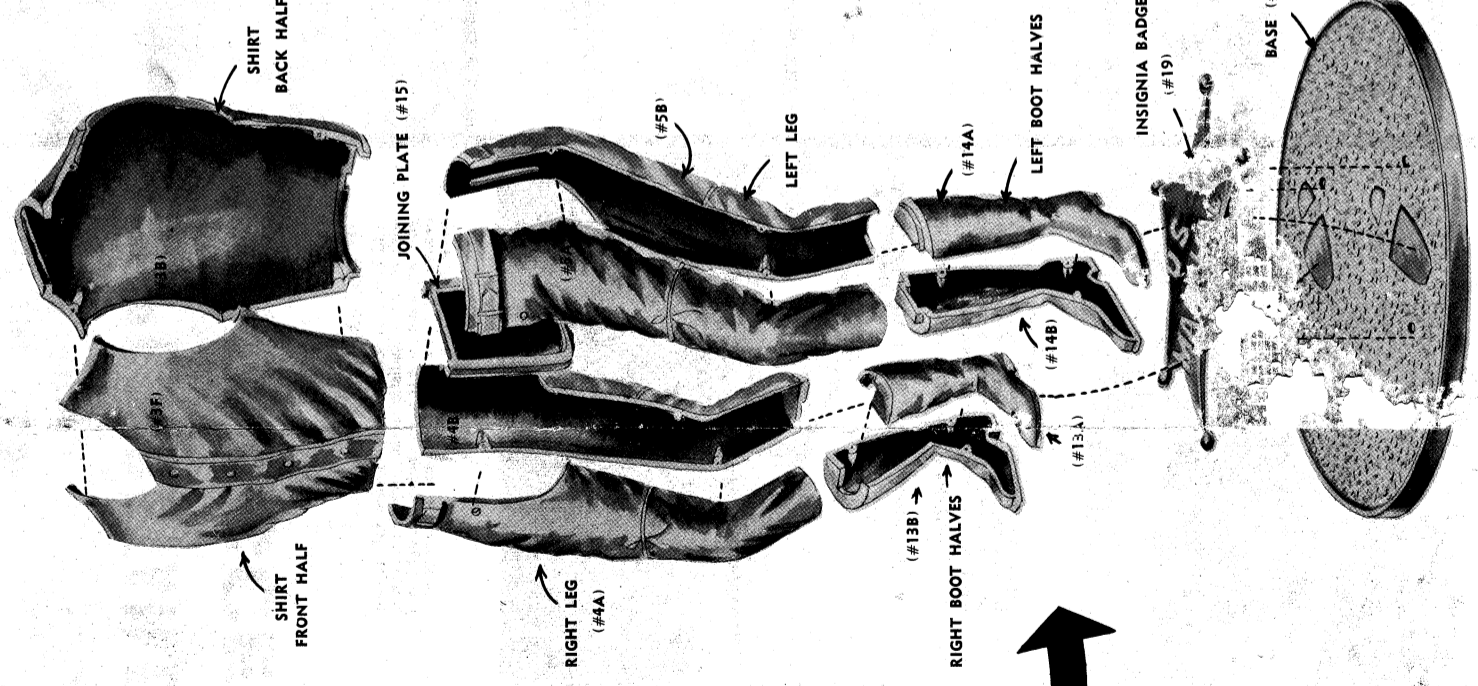
IMPORTANT—APPLY CEMENT TO INSIDE SURFACES ONLY. AVOID GETTING CEMENT ON OUTER SURFACES OF MODEL SECTIONS. USE CEMENT VERY SPARINGLY AND AVOID GETTING CEMENT ON HANDS, SO AS NOT TO MAR OR SMEAR PLASTIC SURFACES.

DO NOT HURRY. WORK CAREFULLY AND PATIENTLY.

IMPORTANT NOTE: BEFORE PROCEEDING TO CEMENT PARTS TOGETHER, IT IS ADVISABLE TO FIT PARTS TOGETHER DRY (WITHOUT CEMENT) SO THAT YOU MAY FAMILIARIZE YOURSELF WITH THE PARTS AND HOW THEY GO TOGETHER. ALSO NOTING THE POINTS WHERE CEMENT IS TO BE APPLIED.

FOR BEST RESULTS ASSEMBLE MODEL EXACTLY IN THE ORDER INDICATED.

1. Cement HALVES of LEFT BOOT together (#14A to 14B).
2. Cement HALVES of RIGHT BOOT together (#13A to 13B).
3. Cement FRONT and BACK HALVES of LEFT LEG together (#5A to 5B).
4. Cement FRONT and BACK HALVES of RIGHT LEG together (#4A to 4B).
5. Locate and cement LEGS' JOINING PLATE (#15) to LEFT LEG.
6. Cement LEFT and RIGHT LEGS together.
7. Locate and cement LEFT and RIGHT BOOTS to LEFT and RIGHT LEGS.
8. Cement BOTTOM of BOOTS to BASE (#20).
9. Cement FRONT and BACK HALVES of SHIRT together (#3F to 3B).
10. Locate and cement SHIRT to PANTS.



Many of the cow towns and villages of the pioneer times called their police officers marshals, and their job was to maintain local law and order, making arrests peacefully if possible, or "robbing" to kill if necessary. A Deputy United States marshal made arrests for violations of Federal laws, and often tried to robbers whenever the job included Federal property. The United States Marshal is appointed by the President of the United States to a certain district for a term of four years. There is a United States Marshal for every judicial district of the Union, who were considered to be more than United States Marshals in a state, including Alaska, Puerto Rico, Hawaii, and the Philippines. The marshal held the respect of all law-abiding citizens and all outlaws. Many of the famous marshals of today were noted fast gun marshals. Many of the large cities such as Abilene, Austin, Dodge City, etc. were made safe by the family settlement in the olden days because of the bravery and fearsome skill of the old marshals.

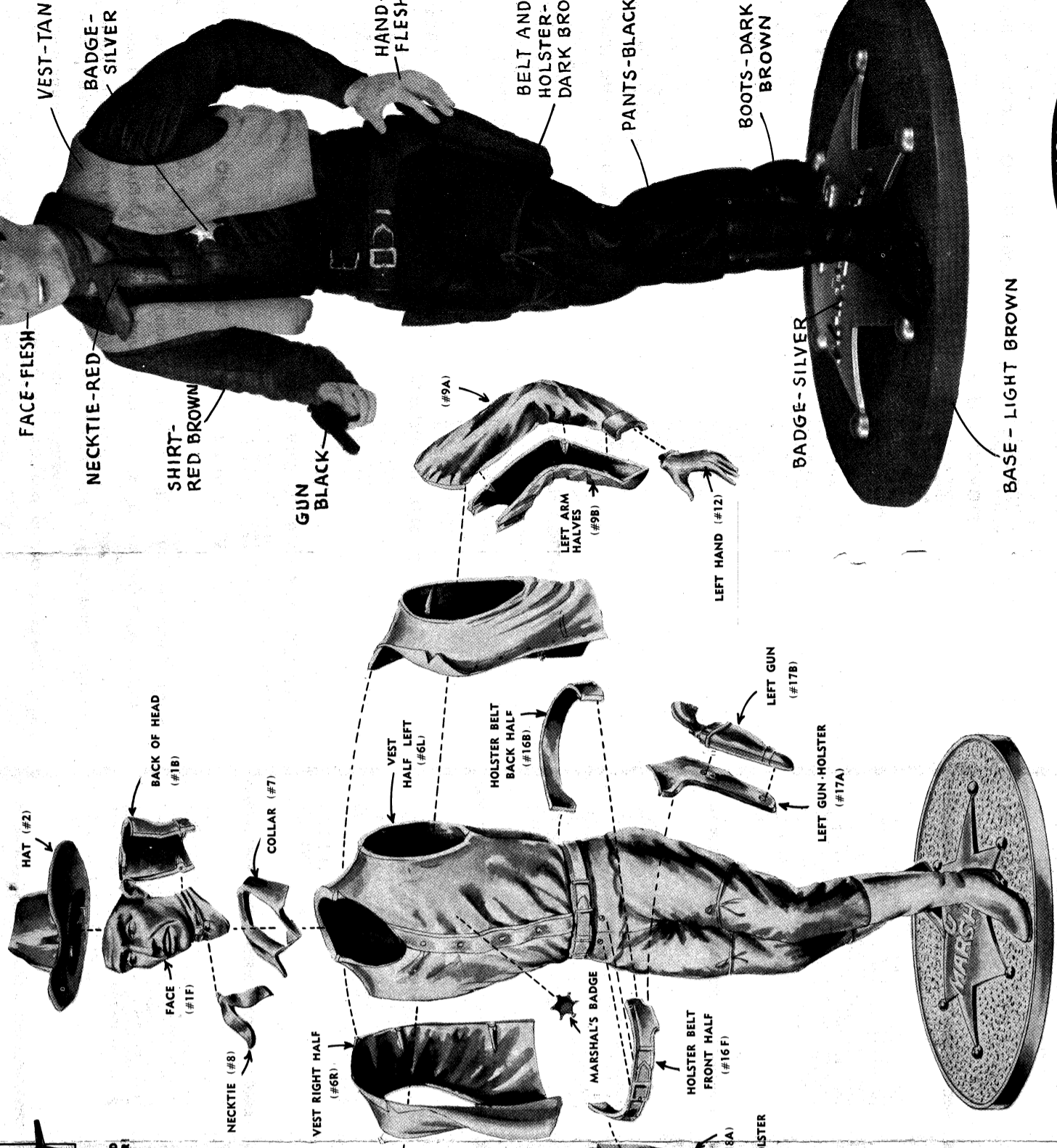
FACTS ABOUT U. S. MARSHALS

The wild west of the middle 1800's brought notoriety and recognition to the marshal to an extent that legends of many marshals are still being told in books, moving pictures, and television presentations. The town marshal was the top law enforcement officer similar to a chief of police. He had to be a man without fear, a "fast-draw" gunfighter, and those that lived had to shoot with deadly accuracy. He was usually armed with two six-guns, and most of the time with a sawed-off shotgun loaded with buckshot at his disposal.

Many former Texas Rangers became marshals because of their skill and experience in fighting law breakers. Oddly enough, many marshals were chosen by the citizenry because of their reputation as "quick-gun killers" and the majority upheld the law and enforced it once they were on the right side. Before Wild Bill Hickok became marshal of Hays City, Kansas in the 1860's his reputation as a killer had already been established. Others in the known killer category who became law-abiding marshals were Ben Thompson of Austin, Texas; King Fisher of Uvalde County, Texas; William Barclay (Bar) Masterson of Dodge City, Kansas; and even Wyatt Earp and his brothers were known as "badasses" before Wyatt became marshal, a famous and well known marshal of his time.

Many notable marshals were men who had always been on the right side of the law (including Pat Flynn (Pat) Garrett of Lincoln County, New Mexico who killed Billy the Kid in the 1880's; and Tom Smith, marshal at Abilene, famous for his fists as well as his guns.

11. Cement FRONT and BACK HALVES of HOLLISTER BELT around HIPS (#16F and 16B).
12. Cement LEFT GUN to BACK HALF of LEFT HOLLISTER (#17A to 17B).
13. Cement FRONT and BACK HALVES of RIGHT HOLLISTER together (#18A to 18B).
14. Locate and cement LEFT and RIGHT GUN HOLLISTERS to LEFT and RIGHT SIDES of HOLLISTER BELT.
15. Cement COLLAR (#7) to SHIRT.
16. Cement FACE to BACK of HEAD (#F to 1B).
17. Cement NECKTIE (#8) to NECK.

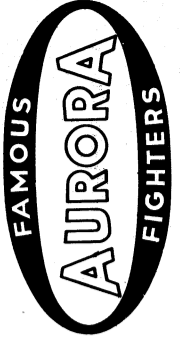

KIT NO. 111 M-2 "MAIL PLANE"

The Douglas "Mail Plane" M-2 can be referred to as the "Grand-daddy" of all the modern high speed mail ships of today. This rugged little plane flying in all kinds of weather created a tradition that has become standard operating procedure in the delivery of U. S. Airmail. Superior realism is captured in the Aurora model. Wingspan 9 1/2". Length 7". Molded in 2 colors.

KIT NO. 115 BOEING P-26A

The Boeing P-26A was the standard fighter of the Army Air Force in 1936 and was considered the best plane of its type in the world. The unique features of a single low wing and all metal construction are still evident in our present day war planes. The Aurora version is a perfect replica of the original with a scale model wingspan of 7 1/2". Length 7".

KIT NO. 116 CURTISS "HAWK" P6E

The P6E was the last production model of the famous "Hawk" designs of the Curtiss-Wright Corporation. This fighter plane was one of the chief pre-war aircrafts to be used in America's defense. The insignia on the perfectly detailed Aurora model is of the famous 17th Pursuit Squadron based at Selfridge Field, Michigan. Wingspan 8 1/2". Length 6 1/2".

KIT NO. 117 CURTISS SBC 3 "HELLDIVER"

As the code letters indicate, the SBC-3 was designated as a two place scout bomber. Powered by a 425 HP Pratt and Whitney Wasp Engine, its ability to dive vertically with a bomb load soon gave this plane its name, "Helldiver," though the SBC-3 was adequate for the pre-war era, more "Helldiver" versions were designed and proved themselves during World War II. The Aurora model has 9 1/2" wingspan, 7 1/2" in length.

KIT NO. 121 BOEING P12E

For the Air Force pilots of the early 30's there was only one plane they wanted to fly . . . the Boeing P12E. Here was the hottest pursuit plane of its time and almost every squadron of the Air Corps used them. The Aurora model brings this exciting plane back with all the detailed features of the original. Scale model has 7 1/2" wingspan and is 5 1/4" in length.

KIT NO. 122 BOEING F4B4

The very famous Boeing F4B4 was a first line fighter of the open cockpit and goggles era. Built in the early 30's, the F4B4 was still in use when World War II broke out in Europe. The scale model features the same high quality and realism that you'll find in every kit that bears the famous Aurora trade-mark. Wingspan 7 1/2". Length 5 1/4".
